The Way of Love Practices for Jesus-Centered Life

In the first century Jesus of Nazareth inspired a movement. A community of people whose lives were centered on Jesus Christ and committed to living the way of God's unconditional, unselfish, sacrificial, and redemptive love. Before they were called "church" or "Christian," this Jesus Movement was simply called "the way."

During our five-week Lent program, we will explore a set of practices for a Jesus-centered life, The Way of Love. Join us on Sunday evenings, March 10 through April 7, for a simple supper of soup and salad, followed by a short program, and concluding with Compline. Supper will be served at 5pm, and the program will begin at 5:30. We will aim to finish each evening by 7pm. Childcare will be available if requested in advance

From the Senior Warden

Rocking the house with the Apostle of Joy!

As the leading advocate of what he calls the "Jesus movement"—head of the movement's Episcopal branch, as he puts it—and easily this country's most recognizable Episcopalian, the Most Rev. Michael B. Curry is a man apart. After his animated message at the wedding last spring of Great Britain's Prince Harry and Meghan Markle—one which left the normally unflappable Queen Elizabeth almost flustered—he is now a global star. He is also among the most gifted orators I have ever heard, bringing his words to life with the kind of booming



verbal flourish that Shakespearean actors might envy, yet with no trace of dramatic artifice, only an overwhelmingly genuine sincerity. Using a microphone—which he hardly needed—he literally gallops among his audience, easily interweaving anecdotes of ordinary life with the divine Scriptures—from First Corinthians, on this night—to drive his message home. As a speaker, he rocked the house. But Bishop Curry is so much more than that: in the words of a bishop of another denomination, Carroll A. Baltimore, he is a "holy man"—and "touchable." I was fortunate enough to be among those from St. James' Episcopal Church who went to hear him speak on Ash Wednesday, at a revival benefit for Bishop Baltimore's international ministries. I call Bishop Curry the Apostle of Joy—for he gladly sings his praises of the love of Jesus Christ, and its healing powers, and the change it can make in all of us, with an infectious joy that no one in his hearing can resist. If he knows he is a star, it does not matter to him, for his preferred star is that over Bethlehem, which long ago heralded the arrival of our Savior, whose love saves us all. "When love breaks out, we all get set free," he told us, and he was right. We were blessed to have seen and heard him, and even more blessed to bring his message back to St. James'—where it must now continue to spread.

\$100 will provide vocational training to help one student pursue a brighter future.


