





As I write this, preparations for our national day of thanksgiving are evident all around. Ingredients for dressing and pies and green bean casseroles fill the grocery aisles, you have to step around carts of fresh turkeys and travelling on I-95 is even more of an adventure than usual. Family and friends are gathering from near and far to pause a few moments to give thanks for all the blessings of the year. It's fortunate WE don't have to wait for a whole year to do that – just consider the prayers of the people at each Sunday's Eucharist. Nevertheless, this is a gateway to a season of holidays – both secular and liturgical. We celebrate a new year in the church's calendar with the beginning of advent. The four Sundays of this season will prepare us for the joys of Christmas to come and then quickly the light of the Epiphany season before we delve into the darkness of Lent. What can I give Him, If I were a wise man Poor as I am? I would do my part,

If I were a shepherd Yet what I can, I give Him –

I would bring a lamb; Give my heart.

May we each find the appropriate gifts to share as we enter this wonderful New Year.


#### Our Mission of the 4th Quarter: Christmas Toys for Children
