





From the Director of Music

The people that walked in darkness have seen a great light – Isaiah 9:2

What a prophet Isaiah was – he knew exactly what I wanted to say to describe the music of the next few weeks: music of the dark days of Advent, as we prepare for Christ's coming, and the music of the light of Bethlehem's star at Christmas time and in Epiphany, the season of light.

Fortunately, Advent's dark days don't require that the music be any less glorious. In particular, I am excited about the anthem we will hear on the fourth Sunday of Advent as Bishop Goff visits us. Savior of the Nations, Come combines the familiar words and tune of this Advent song, sung by the choir, with the tunes Veni Emmanuel and Hodie, Christus natus est, played by flautist Ann Smith and bassoonist Mary Lowe.

In the light of Epiphany the choir will sing Andre Thomas' arrangement of Walk in the Light. This arrangement is every bit as exciting as his recent Keep Your Lamps, for which we enjoyed Bob Blair's percussion accompaniment.

Many of you know I am pursuing a master's degree in church music. My "conducting half-recital requirement has taken the form of a "Musical Meditation for an Advent Afternoon." This service, incorporating music of Bach, Praetorius, and ancient chants of the church will be presented by a 16-member vocal ensemble and 9 instrumentalists. I invite you to join me for this service on Sunday, December 14, at 4:30 pm at St. Barnabas' Episcopal Church, 4801 Ravensworth Road, Annandale.
