The Rector's Remarks at the 2015 Annual Meeting

How are we called by God to follow and serve him? That's a question we should always be asking and answering. Each year the Annual Meeting gives us a chance to report on how we as a community have been answering our call during the past year.

I think that St. James' gives a good answer. As you look through the pages of the Annual Report, you see that we are active and vital, in worship and service. We pray together and for one another. Attendance at our Christmas Eve services this year was



up by nearly 40% over last year. It is remarkable what our outreach is doing to touch the lives of others, whether by feeding them, clothing them, or by building a school classroom for them. We estimate that we've contributed over \$14,000, outside of our budget, to serving the needs of others. Together we are making a difference!

2014 was a challenging year financially, as income fell short of expectations. And as our Senior Warden has presented in our 2015 budget, our income challenge this year will be greater, forcing us to cut essentially all of our discretionary expenses.

I want to make sure that we keep our financial challenges in perspective. This church is abundantly blessed with a generous and supportive congregation. If we did not have a mortgage, we would be the envy of every church in Virginia. We would have resources to hire additional staff, pay the full diocesan and region assessments, and engage in new mission and building projects.

However, the central fact of our budget is our mortgage. It accounts for a third of our expenses. The recent building program was undertaken in all responsibility, at a time when the church was in great need of renovation, and conservative and

reasonable projections planned for a mortgage well within the means of the congregation. But several years and several crises later, the mortgage is a greater burden on us than anyone imagined it could be.

As new members enter the church, and as new members become established members, we can hope that their financial support will increase. We are exploring other sources of income, such as hosting a daycare program here during the week. We should discuss the possibility of a Capital Campaign to pay down the mortgage and to free up our resources for the future.

The finances of the church can feel discouraging. But the abundant life that is here is our hope and our joy. It is our faith challenge to remain focused on what God has called us here to do, to be the presence of Christ, in this place, at this time. We can and should confidently invite and welcome others into the life that we share. Not because we need their dollars, but because we have something they need... the love of God in Christ.

A year ago at this meeting, there was only one person prepared to stand for Vestry. Today we welcomed four new Vestry members. That speaks to the growing life and confidence of this church. I want to thank the Vestry for its service this past year, and a special thanks to Ray Smith for his two years as Sr. Warden. I'm excited about our incoming Vestry, and I look forward to what we will accomplish together in the coming year.

Thank you for the privilege of serving Christ together with you in this place. May God bless us all for the work he has called us to do... to love and serve one another in his name.





Two young women asked, "Where is the nearest grocery?" and returned with two huge bags full of food.

Did You Know?

- If every person and /or family brought one food item to church every Sunday, we would fill the *Little Red Wagon* to overflowing. This food helps supply the pantry at *Rising Hope Mission Church*. The pantry helps feed the homeless and those in need in the Route One area.
- Hot meals are served twice a month to Rising Hope Mission Church—by members of St. James'. Marge Katz has a team of cooks who generously prepare and deliver these meals. Want to help? See Marge.
- The triangle shaped glass box in the entrance Gallery supports *Nets for Life*. Ten dollars buys one net.
- The tabs from aluminum cans (not just soda cans) support *Ronald McDonald House*. Ten pounds of tabs (our last collection amount) cover a family costs for about two nights.
- Coffee Hour, our fellowship time after the 10:15am service, depends on each of us for the goodies. The sign-up sheet is in Braxton Hall.
- Shrove Tuesday is February 17. Come and join us for our annual *Pancake Supper and Talent Show*.
- Our weekend at *Shrine Mont Camp* is scheduled for June 12-14. Everyone is invited to come to this Diocesan Center nestled in the Shenandoah Mountains.
- There is a ministry for each of us. For example the Altar Guild is not just for little old ladies. Talk to Peg Iber or Cheryl Viani for details. The Brotherhood of St. Andrew and the Daughters of the King both have ministries of prayer, service and study. Talk to Dean Sherick and Ann Chadwick for details. If you would like to be an Acolyte, Lector (reader) or Chalicist talk to Father Charles. Maybe your ministry is serving others, cooking, gardening, teaching, or singing- there is a ministry for you!

January 18, 2015

Father Charles Brock called the Annual Meeting of the Parish to order at 11:30 a.m. He led the parish in the opening prayers.

The minutes for the 2014 Parish Meeting were presented. Bob Fitz moved that the minutes be approved as written. Bob Blair seconded the motion. The minutes were approved unanimously.

Bill Iber, Treasurer, presented the Year-End Financial Report for 2014. Bill discussed the actual receipts and expenditures and answered questions concerning his report.

Ray Smith, Senior Warden, presented the Budget for 2015. Ray said that forming this budget was a real challenge for the Vestry as our pledges are decreased and this resulted in major cuts in spending for the coming year. He stated that we do have a balanced budget as required by our By-Laws. He encouraged anyone who had not pledged for 2015 to consider doing so. Increased pledges for the coming year would be welcomed as well. Pledge cards are available for those wanting them.

Bob Blair thanked the 2014 Vestry for their hard work and their service to the parish and asked those in attendance to give the Vestry a round of applause.

Ray recognized the nominees for Vestry: Mark Braden, Eric Katz, Mike Morgan and Francesca Wallace. He thanked them for their willingness to serve. The nominees were elected by a unanimous vote.

Ray thanked Ellen Cleary, Marge Katz and Mary Jane Van den Berg for organizing the Pot-Luck luncheon today. He recognized and presented gifts to the outgoing Vestry members: Jane Fitz, Ben Justesen and Dean Sherick.

Cheryl Viani, Junior Warden, presented Ray with a gift from the Vestry and thanked him for his leadership and dedicated service. Ray said that it had been a good two years as Senior Warden due to the support he received from the Rector, the Vestry, and the congregation. He especially enjoyed working with Charles over the past two years.

Fr. Charles spoke about how are we called to serve God. He said that the reports from the members of the Vestry show that we are a vital congregation, involved in worship and service.

Fr. Charles closed the meeting with prayer at 12:40 p.m.


