Dear People of St. James',

Sometimes on a Sunday morning after church I'll see Alan Moser, and more often than not, one of us will say to the other, "That was good church this morning!" Well, I look back on 2017 and I say to you, "That was good church last year!"

The reports in the Annual Report testify to it. We are living the life of the Church, we are doing the work of Jesus. In Fellowship, Worship, Outreach. St. James' is doing the work of Jesus in all these important areas.

I think that we are poised in 2018 to do more than we expect.

When we began to plan our "60 for 60" Fundraising Campaign last year, there was apprehension that we were setting our goals too high, that not only might we miss our goal but also negatively impact our annual stewardship. But what did we do? We exceeded our 60 for 60 goal by several thousand, and then we knocked the Annual Stewardship out of the park by \$15,000!

We can do more than we expect. And so I ask all of us to think, what more can we do? I'll give a couple of examples.

We have an opportunity this year to refinance our mortgage. And there is the possibility that by refinancing for a longer term, we'll be able to start making extra payments to reduce the principal, and so pay off the loan sooner. Imagine what more we could do by freeing up those resources for ministry!

In 2017 a group of us attended a church growth workshop called Invite Welcome Connect. Now we have the opportunity to apply those learnings. I'm especially excited by the activities of the St. James' Next Group, made up of our younger families and members, to help support connections and relationships among the next generation of St. James' leaders. What more can we do to support the newest members of St. James'?


Stop Hunger Now was again a great success, and the inclusion of Epiphany Lutheran added new energy. We packed 10,000 meals... perhaps next year we can pack 15,000. On the other hand, our Martin Luther King food drive had less participation this year than last... it's time to think of what new thing we should do!

We may be small in size, but we are large in heart and spirit, and in the difference we make in people's lives. In 2018 we will continue to do more than we expect.

As I conclude, I want to remember the special gift that Muriel Freeman left us, a book of limericks for as many members of the church as she was able to write. And, with apologies to Muriel, I offer a limerick of my own.

From the Junior Warden

Dear St. James' Friends,

The season of Lent is almost upon on. It is typically a somber period and a period of selfdenial, reminding me of talking with my friends at school about what we were going to give up for Lent. We would say chocolate, or candy, or there was always that one kid who said he was giving up homework.

As I got older, I thought of Lent as a time of self-reflection, giving up procrastination or taking time to complete unfinished projects. This year, while I will probably still say I

Choir Notes

Dear St. James' Friends,

At the Breaking of the Bread, "the Celebrant breaks the consecrated Bread. A period of silence is kept. Then may be sung or said....<u>some other</u> <u>suitable anthem...</u>" (underscore added) [BCP p. 364]

Listen. Did you hear it? Snap! (Silence) Now!

Let's talk, "Now." I don't mean now as in time, I mean the hymn 333, "Now," first published in 1969. I hope you have taken the opportunity to consider the words of this hymn we are using as the fraction anthem during Epiphany. Note that Jaroslav Vajda, the author, omits both rhyme, punctuation, and verb from each phrase. He opens each with "now" and goes on to list "awesome and exciting things one should expect in worship, culminating in a eucharist and benediction." You may have noticed the



doxology at the end of the text comes in reverse order from that we normally hear. Pastor Vajda explains, "the reverse order of the doxology/benediction not only expressed the order in which I pictured the Trinity coming to us in worship, but also the order in which the Incarnation took place: the visitation of the Virgin Mary by the Holy Spirit, the Son's epiphany as the incarnate Word, followed by the universal blessing that is bestowed upon all in whom this same process occurs."

So after hearing the author's words, and considering the words of his poetry, I share this picture of my understanding of "Now."
