

Music Ministry Notes

"When in our music God is glorified..."*

We have come to the end of the choir's year; your senior choir will be enjoying a few weeks of rest and relaxation before resuming rehearsals again on August 27 and again taking their places in the chancel on September 7.

I want to thank the dozen dedicated denizens of the choir loft for their faithful service throughout this year. They have learned new music, revived old favorites, sung solos, and cheerfully helped lead the worship of the church. By the way, at the same time they were

filling all sorts of other roles in the parish: maintaining the building, paying the bills, planning the crafts fair, leading the Daughters, coordinating mission (and the list goes on).

It is a delight and privilege to be part of the life of the church in its music. THANKS to each of you.

You are invited to be part of the SUMMER CHOIR – no vestments, no Wednesday night rehearsals. Just come on Sunday morning at 9:30 and gather in the choir. We will dust off an old anthem or simply prepare a hymn to be presented at the offertory of that morning's service. Come one Sunday or come every Sunday in July.

As I write this, I am immersed in two weeks of classes of the Church Music Institute at Shenandoah Conservatory in Winchester. It has been a great opportunity to share with other church musicians and professors in the use of music for worship in various traditions. There are lots of great ideas, including some that may not yet be entirely applicable for me, but all offered to the glory of God. I find myself thinking about how our theology is expressed in our songs, and how I could phrase a prayer just in the titles or first lines of the texts. For example,

"Breathe on me, breath of God, fill me with life anew..." "Dear Lord and Father of mankind, forgive our foolish ways!"

Maybe, though, it's better to savor the beauty of the entire text of faithful writers throughout the ages and pray my way through the hymnal. I think one of the hymns that would stick with me is found at #654: "Day by day, dear Lord, of thee three things I pray: to see thee more clearly, love thee more dearly, follow thee more nearly, day by day."

Whatever form your prayers may take, I hope they are with a song in your heart.

Mission of the 3rd Quarter, Schools in Kenya and our Route 1 Corridor

The Outreach Committee proposes to finish building the classroom in Ngambenyi, Kenya. Raising \$2,100 will supply the school with windows, a door, paint for the walls, and make the room useable for the 7th grade. The parents volunteer their work if we can purchase the materials. Fundraising will run from July through September or until the goal is reached. You may use the envelopes in the pews to make your donation. Please mark Kenya in the memo line.

In August, St. James will collect backpacks and school supplies for children of Rising Hope Mission Church and UCM, so that the poorest children in our area can join their classmates in being ready for school in the fall.

Hot Lunches for Rising Hope

Starting in May, 12-14 volunteers delivered hot lunches twice each month for 50-60 of the areas poorest along our Route 1 corridor. The menus included Beef Bolognaise, Chicken, Spaghetti & Meatballs, Meat Loaf all with sides and salads. Each lunch costs the donors \$85-125 total. This ministry is easy because Marge Katz decides the menus, and cookers deliver their dish to the church . More cookers are always needed; any leftovers are frozen or served next day. This ministry will warm your heart and the stomachs of the homeless.

We have two teams that make homecooked meals the first and second Thursdays of every month. The meals are collected at St. James'. The menu for July 3 (Team 1) is hotdogs with beans and a side dish of your choosing. For July 10 (Team 2) the menu is BBQ chicken and a side of your choosing.

Rising Hope United Methodist Mission Church

This Mission Church serves the poorest in our neighborhood. In an average year it reaches nearly 8,000 individuals, supplies 2,000 families with food, and serves 18,000 hot lunches to the hungry. In addition to gatherings for worship, Rising Hope offers Bible study, mentoring, substance abuse counseling. Rising Hope connects the spiritual with the practical through job fairs, interview preparation, budgeting and financial classes, HIV testing, jail visitation, emergency housing referrals, summer Bible camp and more. Nearly 2/3 of Rising Hope's members are, or have been, homeless; many of its successful "graduates" return to volunteer.

Rising Hope is a worthy and successful way for St. James' parishioners to follow Jesus' teaching. Please help us continue the hot lunch and food donation programs throughout the year.
