


#### Dear People of St. James',

We continue to collect seasonal clothing for the folks at Rising Hope. They need everyday summer clothing, work or job interview outfits, linens and


bedding As you sort your clothes and linen closets, save good quality items you don't need. There is a collection box in the gallery.


#### Save Pull-Tabs for Ronald McDonald House

# The May 30 St. James' Yard Sale, Second-Hand Rose Boutique and Bake Sale raised over \$4,700!

Our Vestry has voted to use the funds for two very special purposes. \$1,800 will go to fund half of our Third Quarter Mission, Stop-Hunger-Now. Stop-Hunger-Now provides food and life-saving aid to the world's most vulnerable people and is working to end global hunger in our lifetime. Since they were established in 1998, they have provided over 180 million meals in 65 countries! We are planning an event to support this most worthwhile effort on November 7, 2015, and, of course, you will be hearing more about this soon. Other funds will be used to service the heating and cooling of our church building. The building is in dire need of air temperature and moisture stability to continue to provide a healthy environment for all of us to worship. Thank you again to all for the work that went in to making the Yard Sale such a success and now we are blessed to put these funds to good work.
