### **Word of the Month: FAITHFULNESS**

Faithfulness: true to one's word, promises, vows; steady in allegiance; reliable, trusted; strict or thorough in the performance of duty.

What comes to mind when you hear the word faithfulness? I immediately start singing that age-old hymn, "Great is Thy Faithfulness"!

Great is Thy faithfulness! Great is Thy faithfulness! Morning by morning new mercies I see; All I have needed thy hand hath provided; Great is Thy faithfulness, Lord, unto me!

There it is, in a nutshell. God is there, every day, providing what we need and giving us new opportunities to witness His love and faithfulness. God's promises or covenants with His people have always been kept. There are approximately 277 accounts in the Bible of covenants between God and His people. We can read it in the Old Testament with Noah (Genesis 6:17-18) to Ishmael (Genesis 17:18-20) to Moses (Exodus 19:5) to Jacob (Psalm 105:10). The most earth-shattering example of God's faithfulness is in the New Testament, when He gave the ultimate sacrifice for our sins- his only Son, Jesus Christ.

## **Emergency Preparedness Class**

St. James' is hosting an Emergency Preparedness Class on Saturday, June 10, from 10am to 12:30pm Braxton Hall. Deputy Sheriff Lee Walters (retired Kern County, CA, Sheriff's Office) will specifically discuss what to do in case of serious injury and blood loss. Deputy Sheriff Walters has extensive background in on-scene emergency care and the class will focus on the right type of first aid kit to have on hand, how to quickly and safely remove someone from a location if needed, bandaging wounds, stopping blood loss using elevate, direct pressure and the use of pressure dressings, cardiac and stroke signs. No CPR or first aid card will be issued and the class is not affiliated with or sponsored by any national or regional center. The entire community is invited and the class is free.
