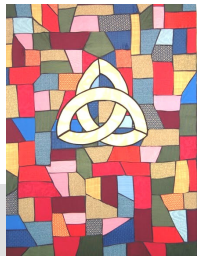

The Power of Pentecost

Pentecost started as a Jewish festival commemorating God's giving the Law to the Israelites 50 days after they escaped from slavery in Egypt.

Just days after the risen Jesus ascended to heaven, his (Jewish) disciples gathered in Jerusalem to celebrate Pentecost. But God transformed the occasion by giving them the Holy Spirit, as he'd promised. The disciples saw something like flames among and on them, heard a rushing wind and began speaking in many languages. The pilgrims in Jerusalem heard about Jesus in their native tongues (see Acts 2:1-12).

In Christian churches, Pentecost was once as important as Christmas and Easter. Today, congregations still observe it in special ways, using the color red to symbolize the Holy Spirit's power. Worship services sometimes include hymns, prayers and Scriptures in various tongues. To simulate the original Pentecost experience, congregations may say the Lord's Prayer in several languages at once.

The Importance of Failure

“Our society is so caught up in winning,” said Carlton Young, “we forget that most of the great men and women in history have, at one time or another, failed at something. Often repeatedly and discouragingly. But each failure is nothing more than a brick in the wall that forms the foundation of our success.”

In *The Upper Room*, Bob La Forge writes, “Failure does not mean that God is against us or that we are hopelessly inept. Failure may be exactly what God can use.”

Moses and David, two giants of faith, also knew failure — and not just the average variety that comes from everyday mistakes. Their huge moral missteps resulted in severe consequences. But failure wasn’t the end of their stories. These men repented and moved forward, and God used them mightily.

And so it can be for any of us who fails or falls short.



“Rest is not idleness,” said John Lubbock, “and to lie sometimes on the grass on a summer day listening to the murmur of water or watching the clouds float across the sky is hardly a waste of time.”

Most of us need more, not less, rest built into our daily routine. Only when we are quiet can we hear God’s whisper.

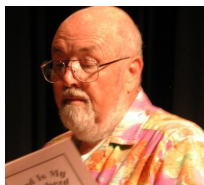
Summer is a great time to find a peaceful, outdoor spot to read, rest and pray — even if only for a few minutes. God is eagerly waiting for us to make space for him.

“ Holy, holy, holy ” – Hymn of the Month

Born in 1783 in the area of Cheshire, England, to scholarly and well-to-do parents, Reginald Heber studied at Oxford University and was ordained to the ministry of the Anglican Church. He served an obscure parish in western England for sixteen years. Throughout his ministry, he became known as a prolific literary writer of poetry, essays and hymns.

Reginald Heber was deeply impressed with the “holiness” of God. Although his superiors frowned on the use of anything but metrical psalms, Heber wrote “Holy, holy, holy” especially for Trinity Sunday to reaffirm the doctrine of the triune Godhead. His sense of the “holiness” of God shines through in the third stanza:

“Only Thou art holy – there is none beside Thee,
Perfect in pow’r, in love and purity.”

Heber accepted the call to become the bishop of Calcutta, India in 1823. After only serving there three years, he suddenly died at the age of forty-three. One year after his untimely death, Heber’s widow and friends published a collection of fifty-seven of his best hymns. Many are still in use in the hymnals of today. We thank God for the gift of poetry and the bravery and reverence of people like Reginald Heber. May the music celebrating the “holiness” of God never cease!

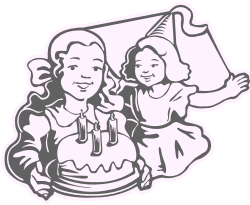

LET US PRAY!

The St. James' family has several forms of corporate prayer. We pray together during our Worship Services. We pray in our daily life. To fulfill the need for specific prayers we have the advantage of two "lists."

The **Parish Prayer List** is published in the weekly Sunday bulletin and the monthly Newsletter, *St. James' Notes*. This "list" asks each of us to pray for those in need. If you would like to include a name or names on the Parish Prayer List, contact the church office at (703) 780-3081 or by email to office@stjamesmv.org. To return to a more correct format, we are once again only using first names. An exception can be made at the request of the family. We also, ask you to notify the office when to remove the name from the Parish Prayer List. If you have submitted a prayer request to the office in the past, please, review the Parish Prayer List now and let us know if you wish to continue the request or have the name removed. The Parish Prayer List will be revised soon.

Another method of receiving prayers is the **DOK Prayer Chain**. The Daughters of the King, as a part of their vows of Prayer and Service, maintain a Prayer Chain. The request for prayers of thanksgiving, healing, strength and guidance are passed through the "chain" of 17 Daughters. Confidentiality is maintained. Last names are omitted, unless otherwise requested. To submit names to the DOK Prayer Chain, call the church office at (703) 780-3081, notify the Rector or call the Lead Caller (Lead Caller is currently Peg Iber at (703)780-0085).

Through these several types of prayer, the St. James' Family can lift our needs to the Lord.

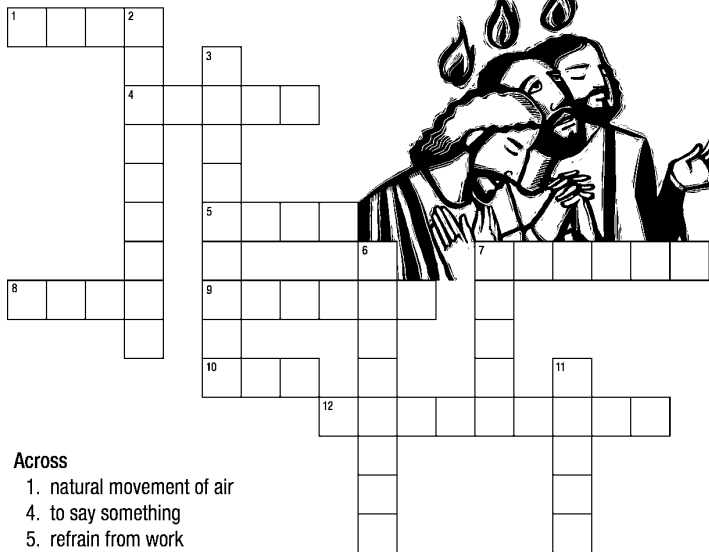

There will be no Adult Education Class. Watch for announcements about plans for this holiday weekend.

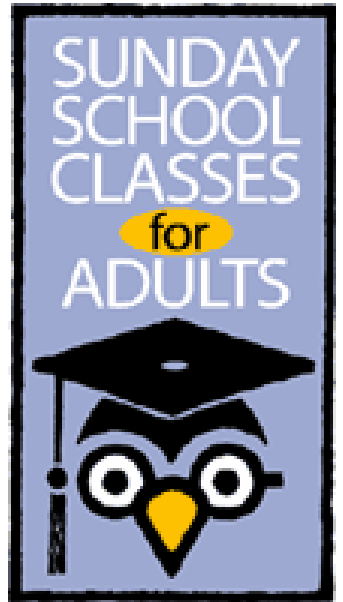
