Dear People of St. James',

When I was a child, my parents took me to church every week. I still remember those Sunday services: fidgeting on the hard pew, drawing on the service bulletin, peering over my father's arm to see the hymnal. But I also remember a couple of special occasions that really grabbed my attention, and that I still vividly recall as moments of grace and conversion.



When we started planning our first Casual Church service, I didn't know what it would look like or how it would work. But I did know what I hoped for: a service that would respect our traditional liturgy, with scripture, prayer, and communion; a service that would be different, fresh and engaging. I wanted a service that would be welcoming to visitors and children, easy to follow and to participate in. And above all, I hoped for a service that we might all be glad to invite others to come try.

I think that our February Casual Church service was a success, on all these counts. Our worship was filled with spirit, and it was a joy to see so many guests and visitors. We will continue to offer Casual Church on the first Sunday of each month. Casual Church will continue to be a work-in-progress, changing and evolving. It may not always look like what you think church should be. But I hope that I will hear more children tell me, "That was the best church service ever!"

Practices for Jesus-Centered Life

In the first century Jesus of Nazareth inspired a movement. A community of people whose lives were centered on Jesus Christ and committed to living the way of God's unconditional, unselfish, sacrificial, and redemptive love. Before they were called "church" or "Christian," this Jesus Movement was simply called "the way."

During our five-week Lent program, we will explore a set of practices for a Jesus-centered life, The Way of Love. Join us on Sunday evenings, March 10 through April 7, for a simple supper of soup and salad, followed by a short program, and concluding with Compline. Supper will be served at 5pm, and the program will begin at 5:30. We will aim to finish each evening by 6:30pm. Childcare will be available if requested in advance

St. James' Used Book Sales

St. James' sent \$178, from the sales of your book donations, to the Wright to Read program at the Campagna Center in Alexandria, VA. This program matches students, identified as at least 1 year, many 2-3 years behind, in grade school literacy. Nearly all are low income; many are English Language Learners, with additional special needs. The program trains volunteers to work 1:1, for at



least a year with a student; many tutor into Middle and High School with the same student. This is a year-round, out-of-school program to help struggling students without loss of class time. Here is a letter of thanks from the program director:

Your donation from your church book sale will help Wright to Read purchase books that our students will read with their tutor/mentors and then take home to build their own libraries. Choir Notes

Dear St. James' friends,

I have been working on planning hymns and anthems for Lent, Holy Week, and Easter. That process has taken me back into some textbooks as well as the lectionary, the hymnal, and the *Book of Common Prayer*. The combination of all those sources makes me realize that what I'm doing is preparing my worship garden for the season, and to observe that the days are growing longer. Why do I mention that observation? It is because we are about to enter Lent. My excursions into Wikipedia tell me that the English word Lent stems from the Old English word for "spring season," and that there may also be an etymological connection to the word for "long" - perhaps an allusion to the lengthening days of this season as we approach Easter.

On Ash Wednesday, we will hear the word of the invitation "to the observance of a holy Lent, by self-examination and repentance; by prayer, fasting, and self-denial; and by reading and meditating on God's holy Word." That sounds somber and painful to me - not an invitation that I jump up with joy to receive. But wait, there's more to the invitation. Digging into the various texts also reminds me that Lent was traditionally a season of preparation for new Christians about to be baptized. The scripture lessons for the Sundays in (not of) Lent help instruct us in how to follow the path of a healthy Christian life. Those lessons are upbeat and joyous. In fact, the two prefaces of Lent will remind us of this at each celebration of the Eucharist during this season:

Through Jesus Christ our Lord; who was in every way tempted as we are, yet did not sin; by whose grace we are able to triumph over every evil, and to live no longer unto ourselves, but unto him who died for us and rose again.

Who dost bid thy faithful people cleanse their hearts, and prepare with joy for the Paschal feast; that, fervent in prayer and in works of mercy, and renewed by thy Word and Sacraments, they may come to the fullness of grace which thou hast prepared for those who love thee.

Aha - Lent is not just gloom and doom, but a time of reflection, study, prayer, discipline, AND joy. I need to get on with tilling my liturgical soil and hope that my crops will help all of us live the liturgy daily - not just hear it on Sunday morning.

To that end, the choir will begin that penitential yet joyful journey of Christian instruction with the anthem *Treasures in Heaven*, echoing the teaching of Ash Wednesday's Gospel lesson from Matthew:

Lay not up for yourselves treasures on earth, ... But lay up for yourselves treasures in Heaven, ... For where your treasure is, there will your heart be also.

May your Lent be full of new-found treasures. Soli Deo Gloria!


