Growth & Evangelism

St. James' has always prided itself on being a welcoming church to all. When a visitor walks through the door, he or she is immediately greeted by the ushers, a member of the welcoming team, and/or Charles. During the service, they are greeted again by the entire church during the peace, and at the end of the service welcomed to join us for coffee hour. However, who's job is it to be the Welcoming Team, or ensure a visitor knows where to sit, or how to use a hymnal? Is it Charles' job, my job, the welcoming team, the Vestry person of the day, your job? The answer is simple: Yes. It is all of our jobs to be welcoming to visitors. Here are some quick tips to help your remember your role and what you can do:

- 1. If you don't recognize someone, go up and say hello and introduce yourself. Just a simple "Hi, I am Mary, I am not sure if we met before" is an easy way to welcome someone to the church. They will most likely respond with their name and tell you it is their first Sunday.
- 2. A person's favorite word is their name. When you learn their name, say it back to them a few times. It will keep the engaged and help your remember their name.
- 3. Ask questions! And not just yes or no questions. Try to find out more about someone than just if they live in the neighborhood or where they work. Don't be afraid to ask them why they joined us this morning or what they are looking for in church. The answer may surprise you.
- 4. Lastly, the best way to welcome someone is to know the person sitting next to you. When you know the interests of those around you, not only will you connect better with them, you will be able to introduce a visitor to them and you have created a connection between those two. If someone new comes in and happens to say they have a basset hound at home, would you know which St. James' member is a huge lover of basset hounds?

Remember: People join people. There are several reasons why someone wakes up on Sunday morning and decides to step foot into church. There is a one reason why they stay: the people. Sometimes just saying hi makes a difference and encourages a family to come back the next Sunday.


Daylight Savings Ends November 4

Choir Notes

Dear Friends.

A couple of observations, if I may:

- 1. When looking at something, it's sometimes as instructive to notice what's NOT there as it is to record what IS there.
- 2. Sometimes great lessons can be found in simple things.

At this point, you may already be asking, "What on earth is he talking about?" My answer: "hymns for children."

I was thinking about hymns that we associate with November. One of these is "I sing a song of the saints of God," (Hymnal 1982, #293) which we might think of around All Saints' Day. One thing that I observed is that this hymn, written for the children of the author, is not found in the "hymns for children" section of Hymnal 1982. In fact, there is no such section in our hymnal. Is that because all our hymns are for all of God's children? Are simple "children's hymns" really so simple or are they just as pertinent to adults as to children? Do adults need to hear the (perhaps not so) simple messages of children's hymns? I don't know the answers, but it's interesting to contemplate.

Back to hymn 293. First published in 1929, this British text found favor in the US and was included in the Episcopal hymnals in 1940 and 1982, although it was nearly omitted from the latter. The author, Mrs. Lesbia Scott, gives lyrical examples of saints through the ages. I am not sure exactly who she had in mind, but a little web surfing suggests the following possibilities (not necessarily the only answers):

one was a doctor: St. Luke one was a queen: St. Margaret one was a shepherdess on the green: St. Joan of Arc one was a soldier: St. Martin of Tours one was a priest: St. John Chrysostom (among others) one was slain by a fierce wild beast: St. Ignatius of Antioch

Perhaps more important is that Mrs. Scott points out that saints are still being made. We can see them all around us ("at school...at sea...at church...in trains...at tea") and "there's not any reason... why I shouldn't be one too." Who are the saints around you? Sometimes it takes a "simple" child's hymn to remind us.
