Dear People of St. James',

As we engage in our annual stewardship campaign at St. James', I encourage each parishioner to pause and reflect on just how much our church means to us. Is it a place to come and worship once a week in shared communion? Or is it more than that? Isn't it truly a place of renewal and rejuvenation, where we may grow and prosper spiritually by working together to serve God?



I find St. James' both a refuge and a jumping-off point in my life, one that provides solace in times of trouble and a spur to my inner growth beyond the other parts of my daily life: job, family, paying the bills, doing yard work. Much of my life outside the church is solitary work—at the computer, in the car, in the library, reading a book—and sometimes I forget how very much more a shared experience can mean. Working together with other parishioners on a project—whether as mundane as changing a chandelier light bulb or as awe-inspiring as donning an acolyte's robe to assist at the Eucharist—is a fresh reminder of how important our parish life is to me. It is addictive behavior—the best kind, of course—but it requires time and commitment.

Finding the time to volunteer isn't always easy, yet it is nonetheless a reward in itself—for it gives me a chance to work with others, in pursuit of a joint goal. When I reflect on our parish life—a joint venture all its own, like a much larger family—I find a renewed sense of worth welling up inside me for the next great challenge ahead.

Volunteering a pledge, much like volunteering one's time, is an important way to nurture one's growth. It offers the chance to make a quiet investment in that larger community of the beloved—and the reward is invisible, yet almost incalculable. When you fill out your pledge card in the weeks ahead, remember that as you grow, so does your parish—and as you support parish life, it supports you in return.





Choir Notes

Dear St. James' friends,

"For all the saints..." we traditionally sing proclaiming the start of the liturgy on All Saints Sunday at the beginning of each November. But this year, we will allow those words to *"...from their labors rest."* Instead, we will sing some of our songs from our Casual Church repertoire. But, lest you feel symptoms of withdrawal, here are some musings about that "traditional" hymn.



How traditional is it? You can apply your own standard, but here are some data. The text was first published in 1864 by the Reverend William Walsham How (1823-1897) during his tenure as Rector of Whittington. He later became a suffragan bishop of London, styled Bishop of Bedford, and subsequently Bishop of Wakefield. You can find some of his other hymns scattered through the Hymnal 1982. And for those of you who bristle at singing ALL EIGHT VERSES of *For all the saints*, you can take heart in its having been reduced from an original <u>eleven</u> (verses about apostles, evangelists, and martyrs are frequently omitted in hymnals).

What about the tune? We are used to pairing the text with Ralph Vaughan Williams' *Sine nomine*, which was composed with this hymn in mind. I find it amusing that a tune which has been called "one of the finest hymn tunes of [the 20th] century" has a tune name which translates to "*without a name*." Prior to the introduction of the tune and text together in the English Hymnal in 1906, *For all the saints* was usually sung to a tune called *Sarum*, composed by Joseph Barnby. This pairing is still preserved in some hymnals, and was included in the 1940 Episcopal hymnal. Disappointed that we don't sing Barnby? You can find two other of his hymn tunes in Hymnal 1982: #427, *When morning gilds the skies* (tune name *Laudes Domini*), and #42, *Now the day is over* (tune name *Merrial*).

By the way, at about the same time that Vaughan Williams' *Sine nomine* was composed for this text, another great British composer, Sir Charles Villiers Stanford, composed yet another tune specifically for use with this hymn. It is known as *Engelberg*, and although it hasn't survived as the tune for *For all the saints*, it certainly has not been forgotten. We find it three times in Hymnal 1982: as the tune for the baptismal hymn *We know that Christ is raised and dies no more*; for the more recent hymn of praise, *When in our music, God is glorified*, and with the hymn, *All praise to thee, for thou, O King divine.*

Bishop How's words may not ring through St. James' this year, but I know we continue to hear "*the distant triumph song....Alleluia, alleluia!*"
