

About Rising Hope United Methodist Mission Church

Rising Hope Mission Church serves the poorest in our neighborhood. In an average year it reaches nearly 8,000 individuals, supplies 2,000 families with food, and serves 18,000 hot lunches to the hungry. In addition to worship, Rising Hope offers Bible study, mentoring, and substance abuse counseling. Rising Hope connects the spiritual with the practical through job fairs, interview preparation, budgeting and financial classes, HIV testing, jail visitation, emergency housing referrals, summer Bible camp and more. Nearly 2/3 of Rising Hope's members are, or have been, homeless; many of its successful "graduates" return to volunteer. Rising Hope depends upon fits and grants from volunteers and non-profit organizations for its funding — it does not receive any Federal financial support.

Hot Lunches for Rising Hope

St. James' volunteers deliver **hot lunches** twice each month at Rising Hope Mission Church. In September we fed 75 the first week and 70 the second week. These folks are the areas poorest along our Route 1 corridor. Each lunch is so appreciated by those being fed. Thank you to Marge Katz who coordinates, and thanks to the cookers who deliver their dish to the church . **More cookers are always needed**. This ministry will warm your heart and the stomachs of the homeless.

How can St. James' help in the Ebola Crisis?

In Liberia and Sierra Leone, Episcopal Relief & Development (ERD) is working to alleviate suffering and contain the Ebola outbreak that has killed 1,427 people in West Africa since March 2014.

Partners in both countries are mobilizing local volunteers to promote accurate information about Ebola and distribute hygiene and sanitation supplies. In addition, the Episcopal Church in Liberia is supplying food parcels for households in quarantined communities and providing basic protective equipment for health workers at local hospitals.

Your gift to the ERD's **Ebola Crisis Response Fund** will help provide food, education on prevention and containment, and medical supplies to people directly and indirectly affected by the outbreak in West Africa. ERD is currently supporting the relief efforts of the Episcopal Church of Liberia and the Diocese of Bo in Sierra Leone

From the Director of Music

Dear St. James' Friends,

Have you picked up a good book of poetry recently?

I hope your answer is, "why of course!" If it's not your first answer, maybe it should be. Why? Simple – poetry is a vital part of our worship together. Not only are the Psalms poems of praise, supplication, and thanksgiving, but the blue book in the church pews isn't just a paperweight – it's a book of poetry. The hymns we sing are poems that are set to music. We sometimes lose



sight of this because of the way hymnals are frequently formatted today: with the stanzas of the hymn in between the lines of the music. This may make it easier to associate the words with their corresponding notes, but may also mask our ability to appreciate the beauty of the poetry.

Remember all those terms from high school English class? Iambic, trochaic, alliteration, metaphor...(there are many more)? All have homes in the study of hymns. Here's an example of paradox (a statement containing opposite ideas) from the hymn, "O for a thousand tongues:"

Hear Him ye deaf; His praise, ye dumb, Your loosened tongues employ; Ye blind, behold your Saviour come;

And leap, ye lame, for joy.

I hope that our tongues are loosened and our minds opened to enjoy the beauty of the poetry that surrounds us Sunday after Sunday.

Welcome! The choir is thrilled to have Peggy Rudesheim join us. We'd love to have you join us, too. Talk to any choir member or to me about singing for a season or all the time.
