



Education for Ministry Program Open to All

How can I connect my daily life to what I read in the Bible and in theological texts? That is the central question undergirding the Education for Ministry program, organized by the University of the South, and taking place at nearby Pohick Church (9301 Richmond Highways in Lorton). Our lively and reflective EFM group consists of six to twelve adult participants, and has two trained mentors. We meet for two and a half to three hours, over the course of a nine-month academic year, for thoughtful and sometimes life changing discussions and a light dinner. The four-year program consists of studies in Old & New Testaments, Church History and Theology. The tuition fee is \$375 per year, and there is financial aid available. Our sessions will be held on Monday evenings, from 7 to 9:30pm, starting mid-September.

Dear Friends,

a new song! Did you hear it? A new SONG! Now do you hear it? A NEW SONG! All around us are the songs of God's creation. And there is a song to be sung - we will sing it on September 9, our kick-off for the new program year at St. James'. There are backpacks and briefcases to be blessed, picnics to be shared, and yes, A NEW SONG! to be sung. Well, maybe it's not new to everyone; in fact, it's the last of the summertime hymn requests, but for me it fits so well with going back to school that we saved it for now. It's called *Earth and all stars*: you can be

Lutheran pastor Dr. Herb Brokering wrote that he "tried to gather into a hymn of praise the many facets of life which emerge in the life of community." I think his catalog also reminds us of the songs of all of creation around us. All these entities "sing to the Lord a new song!"

I was curious, so I consulted Strong's *Exhaustive Bible Concordance* to get an idea of how often the word "sing" appears in the King James Version of the bible. The answer is 102, and 56 of those are in the Psalms. A little more surfing, and I found that there are 176 verses in the Psalms alone where one or more of the words, "sing," "song," or "praise," is used. We are constantly reminded to sing and praise. Perhaps you can already hear the songs of praise in the wind and rain, and in the flowers and trees, in the newly returned school athletes and bands. Listen for Dr. Brokering's whole list when we sing, with your help, *Earth and all stars*.

A new song! Do you hear it now? I hope you will be ready to agree with Pastor Brokering as he says, "I, too, will praise him with a new song!"



As you can see, we at St. James' will be in full swing this fall as we strive to carry out the Lord's work. Ray Smith




