

# From the Jr. Warden

Seems like many of the lessons in life I learn from my kids. God does a good job of showing me how my actions are like that of a child, since no matter how old I am, I will always be His child. So often His greatest lessons come on just plain old routine days in my life. This lesson happened to come on a regular old Wednesday evening. I was watching my then one-year old daughter eat. Now I'm sure most of you know how a one-year old eats: every square inch of themselves, the table, the floor, their hair, clothing, and sometimes even the wall 8 feet away are covered with food. They seem to discover every nook and cranny of their body during mealtime and then find a way to get food into it. They use both hands to shovel the new tastes and experiences into their mouths. They experience the food to the fullest without regard to manners or etiquette or hygiene.

Why aren't we like that with the Bread of Life? Why aren't we less reserved when it comes to taking all of Jesus in? Why do we only take in small bites on Sunday, and then not feed ourselves the rest of the week? Every meal for a young one is messy; it doesn't depend on what he or she is eating. How we feed ourselves with Jesus should be just the same.

As we start a new year of youth and adult education at St. James, my challenge to you is to get messy. Smear God's presence all over you. Get it into every nook and cranny. Don't go the proper route; no dabbing the corners of the mouth; no bird-size bites of His Word. Experience every sensation that His Word and Spirit will bring to you. Strive to experience the bread of life the way that children experience their meals. After all, we are, and will always be, His children.

Please don't let any of these be an obstacle to being part of St. James' choir! I believe that there are solutions to any of these - just ask. Please talk to me at coffee hour, or some other convenient time.

The bottom line is, WE <u>NEED</u> YOU IN THE CHOIR, AND WE'LL BE HAPPY TO HAVE YOU JOIN US! Start with a commitment for a few weeks (for example, until Thanksgiving, or for the Advent and Christmas seasons.)

There are two small donation opportunities that I would like to talk about.

#### 1) The Virginia Episcopalian Magazine

The Diocese of Virginia, the largest Episcopal diocese in the US, mails out 4 issues of their magazine, *VA Episcopalian*, to all members of it's 182 churches. Articles range from what's happening in our smallest rural churches to important matters and positions of our Diocese and our greater National Church. The asking for receipt of the magazine is a modest \$5 per year. Donation envelopes are included in your church envelopes. Please consider donating \$5 dollars to help offset St. James' budget payment to the Diocese. Checks can be made out to St. James', with *VA Episcopalian* written in the memo line.
